The Future of Energy: Choices for Japan and the United States

The Sasakawa Peace Foundation and the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars jointly launched the Japan-U.S. Joint Public Policy Forum in 2009 to strengthen cooperation between the two countries on issues of global importance. As the world grapples with ever growing energy needs on the one hand with increasing concerns about the environmental impact of energy use on the other, this year's forum will focus on the energy challenges facing the two nations.

Energy experts from both the United States and Japan will be discussing the future of energy at this year's conference, and will analyze possible areas for Japan-U.S. cooperation to achieve their respective energy policy goals. In addition to the future of nuclear power, the outlook for fossil fuels, and the threat of global warming, participants will also explore how the growing energy needs of emerging countries such as China and Russia may affect future Japanese and U.S. energy policies.

Japanese public opposition to nuclear power shows no sign of abating since the Fukushima nuclear power plant disaster in March 2011. Japan's decision on the country's future energy strategy and the role of nuclear power in particular will not only have a significant impact on the country's economic and political future, but will also affect decisions made by the United States and other nations. This pressing issue will be thoroughly discussed by the panelists. There will be Q&A sessions for the audience to ask questions. (See attached program).
