Pacific Forum CSIS is now seeking applicants for the 2013-2014 round of Sasakawa Peace Foundation (SPF) Fellows to research in residence at Pacific Forum's Honolulu office. This is a unique opportunity for one US and one Japanese national to conduct extensive research on the bilateral US-Japan relationship and to develop a policy-oriented research paper focused on both the alliance and regional security issues,

We're looking for early to mid-career professionals, who range in age from late 20s to 30s, who hold either a PhD or Master's degree, and who are interested in producing innovative research on the US-Japan alliance. The fellowship lasts six months and includes opportunities to participate in relevant Pacific Forum Young Leaders conferences across the globe.

Additionally, the US fellow will spend up to six weeks in Tokyo and the Japanese fellow will spend up to six weeks in Washington, DC, to conduct interviews and research that will assist in the development of his/her paper.

Applications are welcome from people with a broad range of backgrounds. Previous fellows have researched the alliance using the lenses of energy, biosecurity, cybersecurity, amphibious military capabilities, and others. A \$3,000 per month cost-of-living stipend is provided.

Deadline to apply is Wednesday, May 1.
